What is Truth?

In John's Gospel, chapter 18, verses 37-38, Jesus is on trial before Pontius Pilate. Jesus has just told Pilate that he (Jesus) came into the world to bear witness to the truth. Pilate sarcastically responds by asking, Truth? What is that?

There is not enough space here to go into a full response to Pilate's retort, but some points can be made. First, some things that truth is not.

- Truth is not something that only one group of people, or one institution, government, cult, or leader have possession of.
- We do not find the Truth by comparing ourselves, or the groups to which we belong, to others and then attacking the others.
- Truth is not something that tries to dominate or exclude other people, especially the weak or the oppressed. It does not condemn those who seek to draw what is good from other cultures, or who seek to preserve our environment. It does not judge other people as human beings, especially because of the color of their skin.
- Truth does not twist the meaning of words, so that what is generally acknowledged as good (for example, human dignity, mercy, equality among all people) is proclaimed as bad or useless. Truth does not elevate an opinion to the level of fact simply because social media says so.

Now let's look at a couple positive aspects of truth.

- Truth is the Gospel of Jesus Christ, specifically, his teachings within. Truth is based on loving God and seeking the good of others in need.
- As Paul wrote to the Colossians, we are to clothe ourselves in heartfelt compassion for others, in generosity and humility, gentleness and patience (all virtues). We are to bear with one another, forgive each other and let the peace of Christ be in our hearts. Doing this, along with daily prayer, will prepare us to fully receive the Truth which sets us free – Jesus.

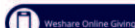
