Introduction

The Jewish people have many different laws and traditions about keeping themselves pure and clean. In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds the Pharisees that having clean bodies does not give us clean hearts.

Gospel of St. Mark 7:1-8; 14-15;21-23)

A reading from the gospel of St. Mark,

One day the Pharisees noticed that some of the disciples of Jesus had not washed properly before eating. It was the Jewish custom to wash up to the elbows before eating, and there were many other rules about washing and cleaning that they strictly obeyed. So they asked Jesus, "Why do you ignore our customs and eat your food with unclean hands?" Jesus answered, "Isaiah was right when h foretold of your hypocrisy! You have made the laws of men more important than the laws of God. Listen to me. It is not what goes into a person that makes them unclean, but what comes out of that person. Ordinary dirt cannot make our hearts and lives unclean. Only wicked words, thoughts and actions can do this because they come from the heart."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
