Psalm 95:8

Part I - Hearing God's Voice

In the liturgy of the Church, there is a response verse sung or proclaimed between the first and second readings. It usually is a verse from a psalm, and sometimes it is this: If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts. At first hearing, it sounds a bit strange. How does one "hear" God's voice? Why would hearing it make our hearts hard?

The phrase has its roots in the saga of the Hebrew peoples' exodus from Egypt. On the long journey, the people came to a place in the desert where there was no water. They complained and contended with Moses, their leader. He prayed to God who told Moses to take his staff, go to Mt. Horeb with all the people, strike the rock, and water would come forth. He did so and the people had water. However, the place was ever after named Massah and Meribah, which means testing and quarreling.

For us today, can this story hold any meaning? Can someone actually hear God's voice? Hearing God's voice is a metaphor that represents being awake to the guidance and will of God. We can hear God's voice when confronted with harm or abuse to other people, to poor or simple people being taken advantage of, or to any of the many inequities of human life.

Part of the hearing of God's voice is to recognize that it is God's voice. God does not speak to people to tell them to kill or torture or oppress or abuse. That is the voice of the impostor. God does not voice the concept of power over others, greed, sarcasm or arrogance. In the first book of Kings, chapter 19, the prophet Elijah is being pursued by his enemies. He takes refuge in a cave. Elijah listens for God to speak to him, to help him. A tornado blows past. Then an earthquake shakes the very mountain, and then consuming wildfire. In all that, Elijah does not hear God's voice. Finally, Elijah hears a small, murmuring sound. He then leaves the cave because he knows that what he heard at the end was the voice of God.

God's voice is gentle and clear. God wants us to love him and take care of others as best as we can. We hear God's voice when we are aware of someone in distress, someone being pushed down or out by another, such as when a person of color or someone who is nonbinary is attacked or mocked. We hear God's voice calling when we see the damage we are causing to our environment, or the injustices done to those without power or money.

God voice is the thought within us, when confronted by injustices, that tells us this is wrong, that this is something that cannot be justified or excused. Most people know right from wrong. Yet there have always been a number of those who reject God's voice — who shun responding to what God is asking of them because they fear losing their money or reputation or worse. Basically, it is a refusing to trust that God helps those who kindly help others in need. It is a modern-day Massah and Meribah.
