Who is Our Neighbor?

I received great lessons about neighbors as I was growing up in Eau Claire. Our front door lined up perfectly with the old Sacred Heart Hospital. In the early 1960s, a new hospital was built and the former hospital across the street from our house was repurposed as a home for troubled youth and given the name the Eau Claire Academy. Back then we called the young people who lived there "juvenile delinquents." Even though I instinctively knew from a young age that most of the youth living across the street had troubles of some sort (how could I miss it when another flaming mattress was flung out of a window, triggering a response call from the Fire Department), I developed positive relationships with many of the young people.

These "juvenile delinquents" would wander over to the school playground in the evening and played basketball with us. They were the kids who came down to the local park and played softball in the summer rec league. They were the "others" who we hung out with on the street corner outside of the Academy. When we were playing basketball, trying to win the softball game, or conversing on a street corner, the young people from the Eau Claire Academy were not "the other" or our enemies. No, the youth who lived across the street from our house on North Dewey were our neighbors.

This weekend's Gospel passage from St. Luke is the Parable of the Good Samaritan, my personal favorite. Recently, in his encyclical entitled Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis reflects on this popular story. He pulls each character out of the story, using a Jesuit prayer form known as Ignatian Prayer Reflection. Pope Francis invites us to place ourselves in the story as each character, one at a time. First, we might be the victim; then the robbers, followed by the priest, the Levite, the innkeeper, and finally the Samaritan. It is a great way to see and hear the story in a new and challenging way, asking what it feels like to be that character.

Tony's letter continued...

Why did Jesus tell this story in the first place? Remember, he is confronted by a scholar of the Jewish law, wanting to know how to attain eternal life. The scholar knows all of the right answers in his head, but it sounds like it has not yet made that long, difficult journey to his heart. Jesus questions him on how the law deals with eternal life and the scholar is able to quote perfectly that one is to love God and love one's neighbor. Then the scholar asks the most difficult and important question in all of the Scriptures: Who is my neighbor? Jesus, through the Good Samaritan story, shows that the neighbor is both the one who needs our help and the one who helps.

Who is our neighbor? The newly settled Afghan refugees who attended a picnic supper at Res on June 20 for World Refugee Day? The LGBTQ+ persons that many of us learned more about during the United Way LGBTQ Challenge earlier this spring? The person who might differ with us in our definition of what it is to be pro-life? The person who votes opposite of us?

They are all our neighbors. They might not live across the street from us, but the neighbor is each person we encounter every minute of every day. And our neighbor is the person who we do not encounter but are still called to love.


Sleep in Heavenly Peace **Book Drive**
