The Book of Psalms Part 2

Hello, and God's blessings upon you. Today I would like to continue my discussion of the Book of Psalms that I began last week. Again, the Book of Psalms is the only book that we read or sing from at every Mass. Last week I discussed authorship and the title "Books of Psalms". Today I would like to talk about the Book's structure.

The Book of Psalms is divided into five smaller "books". Each of these is marked by a concluding expression of praise to God. This concluding expression of praise is called a doxology. It is common therefore to speak of Book I (Pss 1-41), Book II (Pss 42-72), Book III (73-89), Book IV (90-106), and Book V (107-150). Jewish tradition concludes from this fivefold structure that the Psalms constitute a Davidic Torah, that is a Davidic counterpart to the Mosaic Torah (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy).

Throughout the Book of Psalms modern scholarship has identified various types of psalms that share common elements. (1) Praise Psalms, these are hymns that summon all people and nations, and sometimes, all the earth's creatures to worship the Lord for his mighty works of creation and salvation (e.g., Pss 8, 33, 65, 95, 100, 103, 145-50). A subclass of this type, called "Songs of Zion" is a collection of hymns that praise the Lord for blessing the city of Jerusalem, and the Temple (e.g., Pss 46, 48, 76, 84, 87, 122). (2) Lament Psalms, this is the most common type of psalm. In an individual lament, the Psalmist cries out to God to be saved from hardships such as illness, enemies, and injustice (e.g., Pss 3, 5-7, 17, 22). In communal lament, the Psalmist intercedes for the community of Israel as it suffers from famine, drought, or military defeat (e.g., Pss 44, 60, 74, 79-80, 126, 137). Lament psalms often begin with pleas for divine help and end with praises to God for his anticipated intervention.

(3) Thanksgiving Psalms, these are psalms of prayerful gratitude to the Lord. Also divided into individual (e.g., Pss 30, 40, 92, 116, 118} and communal (e.g., Pss 66, 67, 107, 124, 129} types, these psalms express thanks and praise to God for acts of deliverance in the past. (4) Royal Psalms, there are two types of royal psalms. One celebrates God's reign as king over Israel, the nations, and all creation (Pss 47, 93-99}. Another type celebrates the Lord's covenant of kingship with David (Pss. 89, 132} and can take the form of prayers for Israel's king (Pss. 20, 72) or prayers that celebrate special occasions such as the king's coronation (Pss. 2,110} or wedding day (Ps 45). (5) Additional Psalms, these are other Psalms including Wisdom Psalms, Penitential Psalms, Hallelujah Psalms, Psalms of Remembrance, Psalms of Trust, and Psalms of Ascent. More on this fifth category in another bulletin article.

Breakfast after both Sunday Masses



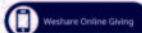
