INTRODUCTION

Gospel

A reading from the gospel of St. Luke.

Jesus chose seventy-two disciples and sent them out in pairs to all the towns and villages he would visit saying, "Take nothing with you, and wherever you are welcomed, make the first words you speak be, 'Peace be with you.' Stay if you are invited to and eat and drink whatever you are given. Cure the sick and share the Good News of God's love with everyone. If you find people unfriendly or unkind, leave them and their village and go elsewhere."

Soon the disciples returned and told Jesus about the marvelous things they had seen and done. Jesus said to them, "be happy, indeed, because your names are written in heaven."

Dear God, help me to remember that you will give me what I need.






Draw a picture of yourself telling a friend about Jesus.



Find the safest way to get to the mountain.






Make a card for one of your neighbors, and tell that person, "Jesus loves you!"


Lord, help me heal others with kind words.
