One servant did wat his master had old him, even though he did not know when his master would return. The other servant betrayed is master's trust and did not carry out his wishes. When the master returned unexpectedly, the good and trustworthy servant was generously rewarded, but the other servant was punished and sent away."

Those who know what their master expects from them, but choose to disregard him, will receive the appropriate punishment. If someone has been trusted with a great deal, then a great deal will be expected from that person.
